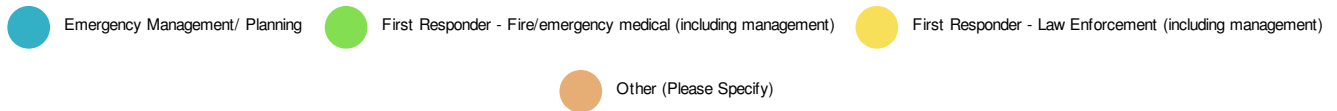
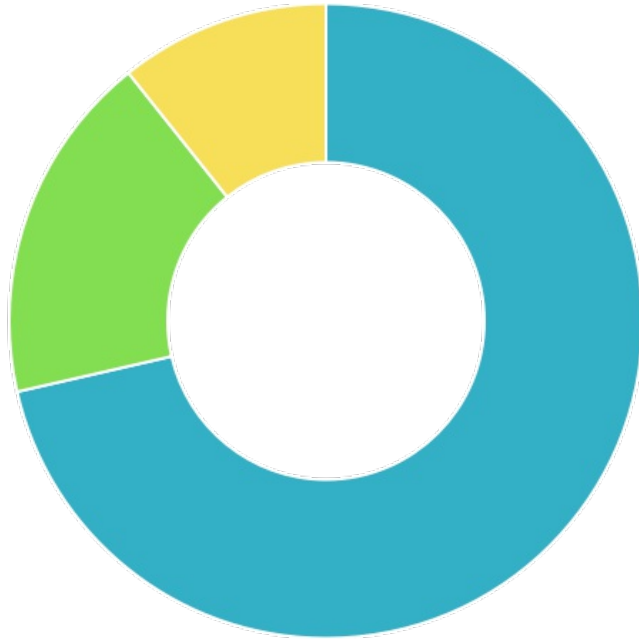

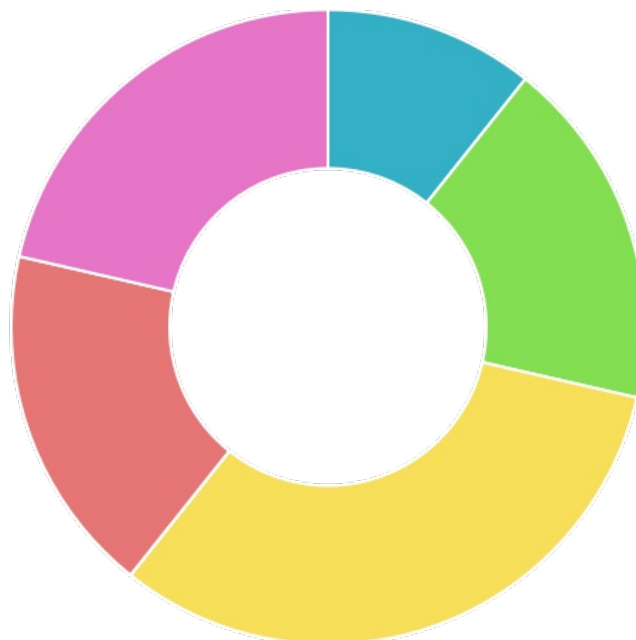
Are you pretty confident that you know which pipeline companies operate in your jurisdiction?

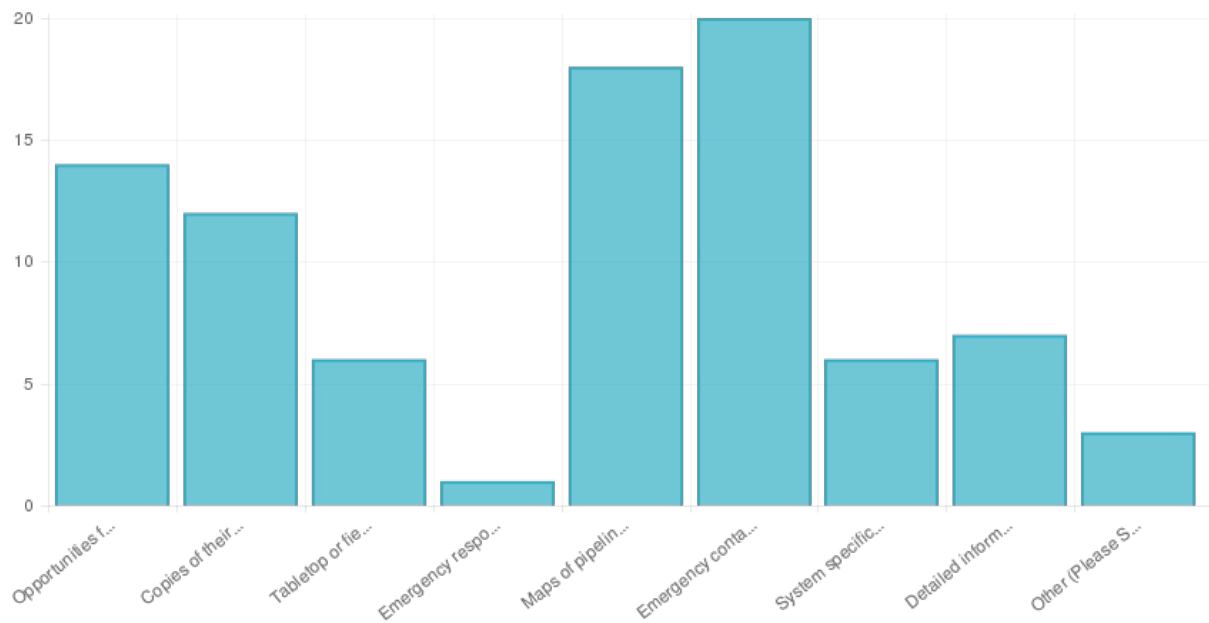

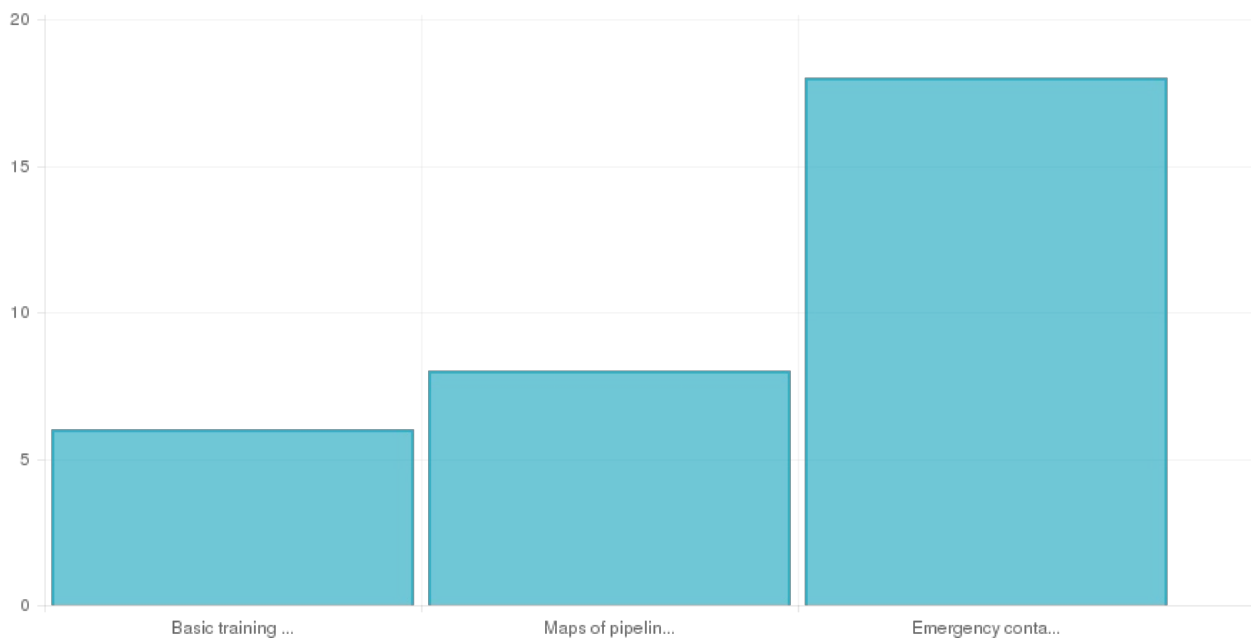

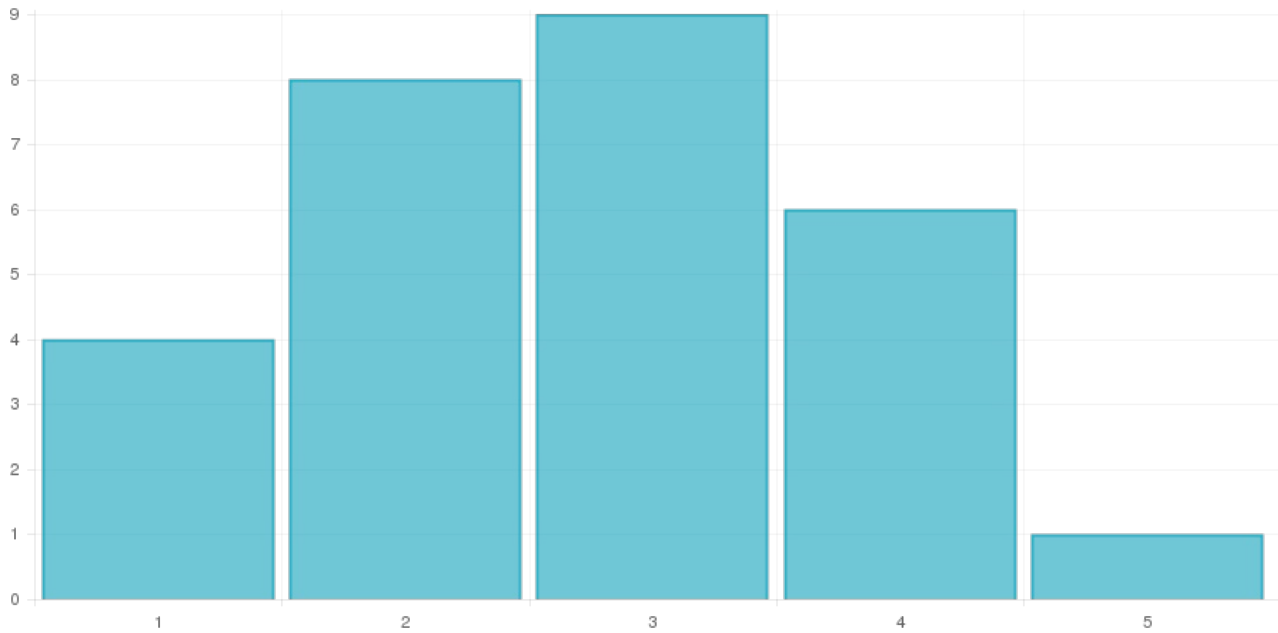

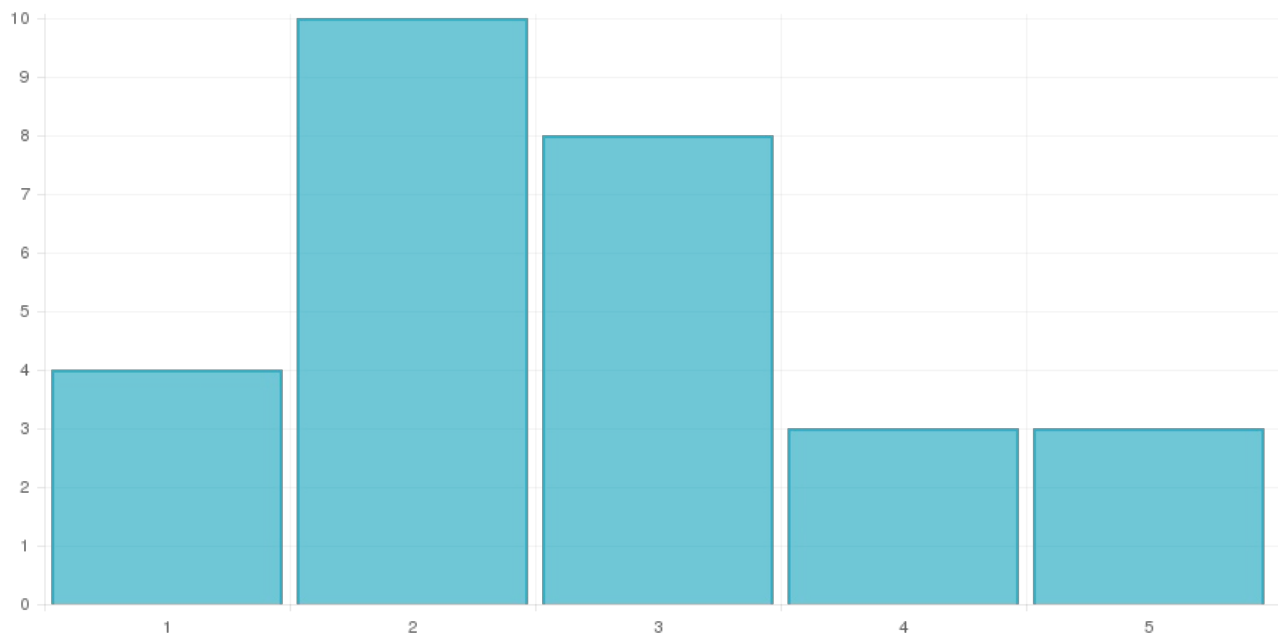

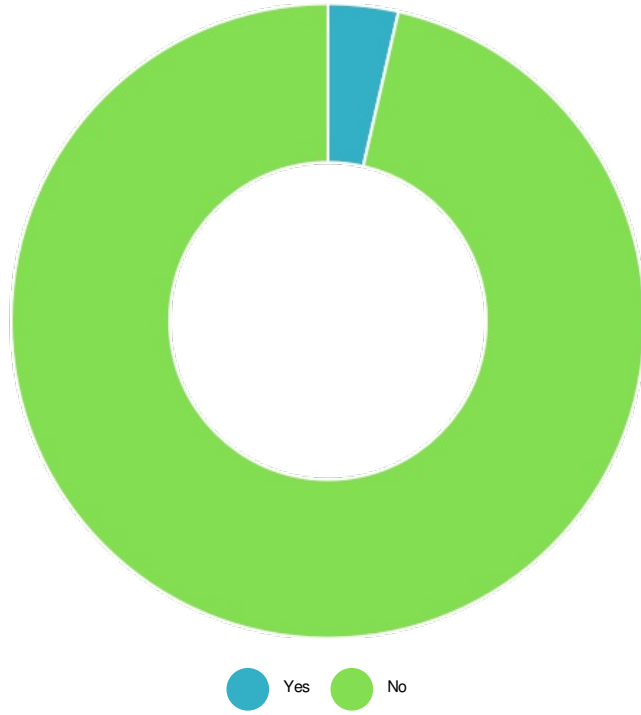

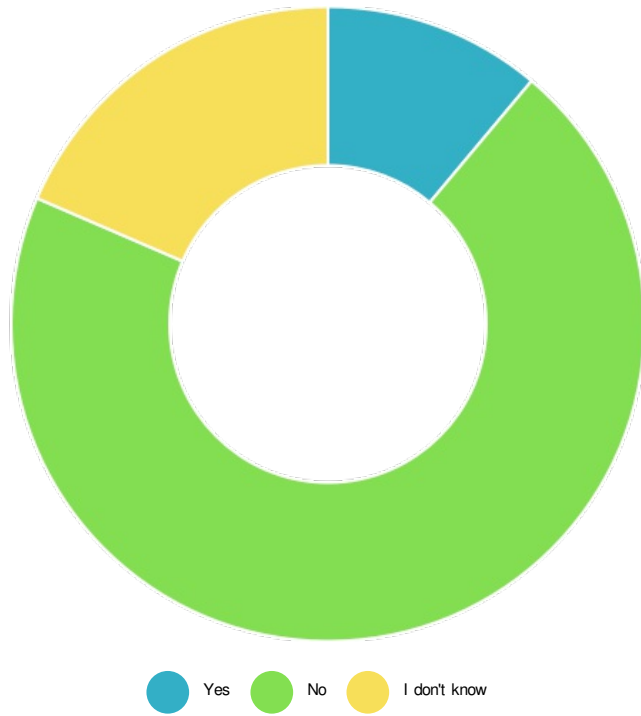

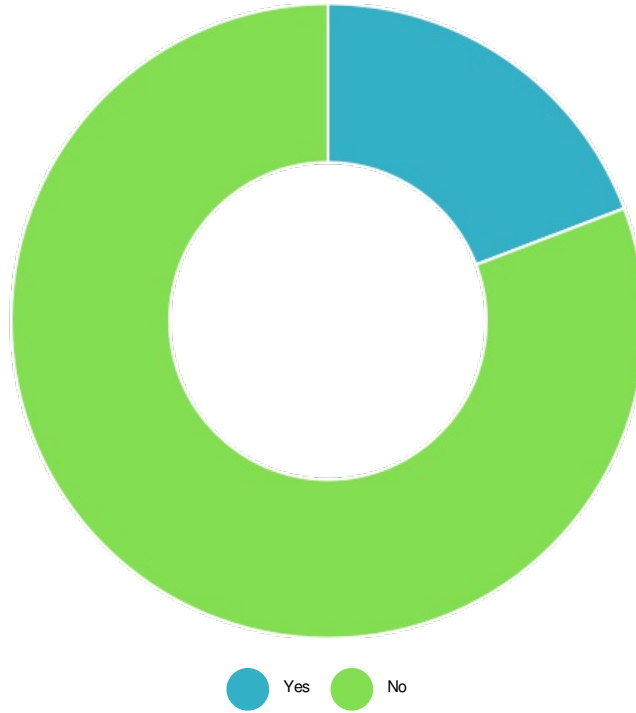
